I operate from my home on the hill above Waipiata and you can find my honey for sale in the local Waipiata Country Hotel. I sell a 100% Raw honey that has not been heated, blended or pasteurized. I have also just branched out into making creamed honey, this is also made without blending any other honeys heating or pasteurizing. As well as using my business for my business studies course at school, this year I have entered my business into the young enterprise competition, this is a national scheme consisting of 5




challenges where young entrepreneurs compete to win their regions pool and then the regional winners have the chance to win a share of a \$25,000 prize pool at a national level. Peter was successful in being awarded \$400 seed funding from Otago University, he was one of two businesses in the greater Otago region.

Hi there! It's Paris, Madi and Lucy here from Year 13 at Maniototo Area School. This year our business is inspired by our plan to travel to Fiji to work with Habitat for humanity and help some of their communities in need of clean, accessible water. In order to be able to travel there we will need to fundraise some money and to do that we have decided to make and sell deep fried, filled donuts. Our business is called Totoka donuts, which translates to delicious donuts in Fijian. We will have some festive Fijian flavours and use locally sourced ingredients for our fillings. We will sell our donuts within both the community and to children at school.

We are also taking part in the Young Enterprise competition in which teams compete to run a business. Our next challenge is to pitch our idea to a

group of judges. Totoka Donuts was also lucky enough to gain \$200 seed funding from Otago University.

We are BAM! And we are selling our Bam! organic dog treats. These are homemade organic dog treats and come in a variety of different flavours. All of our dog treats are organic, the most basic of recipes include ingredients such as Natural peanut butter, eggs, and honey. Some of our recipes will include fruits and vegetables too, such as apples, carrots and pears for your dog to get healthy nutrients as well as a tasty treat. These will be available to purchase in Term 3. We have entered our business in this years Young Enterprise Competition, there are 4000 teams currently entered across NZ. BAM was also lucky enough to get \$200 seed funding from Otago University.
