NCEA RESULTS 2020: As I mentioned at last year's Prizegiving, our senior NCEA students have done admirably well. Out of a total 26 students in NCEA Level 1,2, and 3 we had a 96% success rate. A shout-out to Peter Cheesmur who achieved an Overall Excellence Endorsement at Level 3. Achieving Overall Merit Endorsements at Level 3 were Sam Flanagan and Madison Pont. At Level 2, Michaela Clark, Anna Stuart, and Ben Voice attained Overall Merit Endorsements. At Level 1, Charlotte Gregan, and Tayla Munro gained Overall Merit Endorsements. This means that over 30% of our senior students have received endorsements. We are so proud of them and all our students. Thanks also goes to our dedicated staff of teachers and teacheraides who are part of this success story.

ACADEMIC TARGETS & GOALS FOR 2021: Writing remains a school-wide target for this year. We aim to focus on writing across all subjects both in junior and at the secondary levels. Already, our teachers have engaged in professional development in order to help our students attain high levels of writing. We will keep you informed of our progress at regular intervals.


Ben Voice was also chosen as Head Student but has since left school to take up a place on the Automotive Engineering course at Otago Polytechnic. We wish him all the best.

PEER MEDIATION TRAINING




I made a truck. It is red.




