BIOLOGY TRIP

From 17th—19th March the Year 13 Biology class and teacher Mrs. Kate Dowling joined Roxburgh Area School, Twizel Area School, Mackenzie College, and Opihi College for a three-day hands-on marine biology investigation.

They carried out investigations on different intertidal crab species and measured behavioural reactions. The students were instructed by University of Otago staff members within the Portobello Marine Laboratory and gained much knowledge and experience about scientific investigation and collecting and processing fieldwork data at the university level.



All students and staff resided at Quarantine Island and were fortunate to have glorious weather and also the use of a larger tour boat as our water taxi over the three days.

The students thoroughly enjoyed mingling with the other schools and making new friendships upon the island.




