
They were introduced to risk management and demonstrated a high level of self-management skills through a variety of O.E activities.

HANDS ON AT THE MARINE LABORATORY

The Year 12 Biology students thoroughly enjoyed their field trip to the University of Otago Marine laboratory along with Roxburgh Area School students.

We were lucky to have a smaller group so that we were all able to have a full hands-on experience. We learnt about the ecology of the rocky shore intertidal species and performed a survey looking at the habitat and adaptations of species living within this zone. We also were able to look at and compare various marine species and dissect a dogfish. The dissection showed us how the respiratory, circulatory and digestive system function within fish.
