# Maniototo Area School

#### Year 5 & 6 Camp

Then school was finished for the day and some people got caned on the way out on their bottom, even some girls.

On the first day of camp, we went to the Arrowtown Museum. We did an A to Z scavenger hunt. We had to do it with partners to make it easier to find. We found a revolver, a sheep dip, the bakery, rocks, and something called a lavatory that had a man in it and many other things.

After Miss Grey's class, we sat in a circle and put on these Michael Jackson gloves because the oil on our skin could damage the artifacts. Then we got handed some old artifacts and we inspected them to try and figure out what they were used for. After that, we put them in a timeline of where it was supposed to go. Then we talked about some things we didn't know like how to toast bread in the olden days because they didn't have electricity back then. They had to use a fire to toast bread.

We had to walk in the rain and mud to get to the Chinese village. The Chinese had to build their tiny cottages out of wood, tin, clay, and stone. They had to flatten the tin down so it would fit over the top of the roof. They also worked gold panning but they were in a bad part of the river where there was not much gold, so they had to work harder.

We drove up to Vincent ski lodge where we were staying for camp. A big lounge and a door were leading to two hallways, 1 leading to the girl's side and the other leading to the boy's side. 
