

Position 1: Caretaker/Groundsperson

Maniototo Area School is looking for a Caretaker/Groundsperson to join our team.








Breakfast is available to all our students <u>everyday</u>.

Senior BCITO students are working hard to finish their projects. A dog run, a desk with twin drawers, a storage chest with a parquet top are just some of the creations being made this year.






















A few Mothers Day gifts going home last term from the Year 9 & 10 students as they explored New Zealand native and exotic timbers in the laminated chopping board project


We would appreciate some parent help for transport and both on and off the ice.
