

Strive is a programme especially for our Year 10 students, it encourages students to dream big, make the most of all school opportunities and develop their leadership skills. The programme is open to all Year 10 students – all requirements must be completed within the school year.

To complete the programme, students have to meet the academic, attendance, service and curricular goals.

These are:

- 85% attendance each term
- Read one novel or non-fiction book per term
- Complete 20 hours service across a year (we can help organise this)
- Participate in at least one sport or cultural activity
- Gain a Merit average in 3 nominated subjects
- Mentor junior students
- Complete one public speaking engagement
